BEFORE ANY LEADERSHIP CRISIS

- Under **pressure**, the heart of the leader is coaxed to believe a lie. **Jeremiah 17:9** says, "The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows how bad it is?"
- This is never more true than in seasons of stress. When the heart and mind want to whisper things like, "**just this once**" or "**no one will know**" or "**I'm not hurting anyone.**" A **wise** leader has already answered those questions... **No!**
- No, because they have decided a course of action prior to any personal leadership **temptation**. No, because they have done the work to fortify their principles. No, because they build strongholds around those principles in their hearts and minds. It is so essential that values **govern** the processes of a leader's life.

HOW CAN LEADERS EMERGE UNSCATCHED?

Unlike Peter, the leader stands when they face accusers and maintains their relationships. Like Mary, they respond, "be it unto me according to Your word" and experience God's promises. Unlike the children of Israel, they are not fearful of giants or walled cities, but rather they take on the future with full confidence in their God. These leaders lead in difficult times. These leaders know what to do. These leaders stand in the face of their enemies and overcome because these leaders live by principles not pressure.



2. THE PRACTICE OF GOD'S PRESENCE BUILDS THE LEADER'S CONFIDENCE. This is an awareness that the Holy Spirit is available to assist the leader with decision making challenges (**JOHN 14:13-15**).
